In any fast-changing scenario, the ability to react quickly but rationally and calmly is essential. As a small company with a small team, we can always be light on our feet to respond but will do so after careful review of the situation and with a calm appraisal.

As a cross-cutting economic activity, tourism can contribute to wider economic and social recovery through jobs and revenue. We must all act with caution but also endeavour to maintain the economic role of our business in supporting 36 employees, their families, and the wider community where we are located, of our supplier and industry stakeholders. Safety and health come first, of course, and decisions are taken on the precautionary principle.
